112 - Pastor as Theologian in the Wesleyan Spirit

Consideration of the role and responsibility of the pastor as theologian with emphasis upon our Wesleyan heritage and the student's own growing sense of theological identity. Basic terms, tasks, and methods of Christian theology are introduced, and representative themes, both classical and contemporary, are defined and illustrated.

Objectives include:

- 1) Challenge students to re-examine their understanding of faith.
- 2) Critical consideration of theological methods and the role of the Wesleyan use of scripture, tradition, experience, and reason.
- 3) Introduction to theological language and problems therein, such as theodicy, revelation, christology, law and grace, justification, ecclesiology, and eschatology.
- 4) Development of pastor's identity as a theologian.
- 5) Utilization of theology as a resource for pastoral functions.

Written Work:

Our standard deadline for submitting work is one month before each class session. Anything arriving later than that will need a special exemption in order to be accepted.

All papers must be typed and double-spaced with one-inch margins on all sides. Use Arial 11 or Times New Roman 12 for fonts. Do not add a title page (save a tree). Your title should appear on page 1 with your name on each page. All citations must be footnotes using the style found in Turabian or another standard footnote source.

Grades:

The COS school now requires that we give a letter grade. In graduate school an A to A- is considered excellent, B+ to B is considered very good, B- to C is a passing grade. Any grade of C- or below indicates that the student needs additional help in understanding and working with theological concepts.

Grading Score:

1. Class participation 40% - 40 points possible for each session.
2. Having all assignments in on time with good grammar, spelling, and proper footnote citations 10% - 10 points possible for each session.
3. Written assignments 50% - 50 points possible for each session. Note that each assignment has a point number assigned.

Written Assignments:

Assignment for the First Session - A paper with four parts -- five to six pages total (50 points total).

The first part: According to Gonzalez and Carder, define Theology. How is Theology different from Philosophy? What are the limits to Theology? 10 points

The second part: How do we know God? According to Gonzalez, why do the proofs for the existence of God come up short? What is the Word of God and how does it best get communicated? Why does Gonzalez tell us that the best way to approach the Trinity is not to explain it? 10 points

The third part: Four questions, each worth 5 points.

- 1) What is the Gnostic error?
- 2) What is the danger that Gonzalez lifts up by teaching that sin is an inheritance?
- 3) What is our responsibility toward the creation?
- 4) What positive things can be learned from evolution regarding the creation?

The fourth part: A family comes to you for counsel. Their son has died in a terrible accident after drinking and using drugs. The parents have been told by their preacher that the boy is lost. How will you approach this situation, what will you say, etc? 10 points

Assignments for the Second Session (50 points total):

First paper (2-3 pages) -How do United Methodists understand the following terms:

Prevenient grace, Justifying Grace, Sanctifying Grace (20 points total)

Second paper (2-3 pages) –

According to Gonzalez, who is Jesus the Christ? Is Jesus human like us? If so, how can he also be divine? (20 points)

According to Gonzalez and Carder, what is the mission of the church? What changes do we need to make for the church to accomplish its mission? As pastor, how do you see your role as servant leader in the church? (10 points)
